Ultimately, Olga frees herself from the psychological hold of her captors and releases her heart from 40 years of suppressing the memories of violence perpetrated against her. She finally finds peace, and in the process of healing, the love of her life, Vola. Soprano **Aléxa Anderson**, tenor **Eric Levintow**, and mezzo-soprano **Jessica Gonzalez-Rodriguez** make up the cast for the premiere of this important work.
